Good day this is Mark J. Lindquist here from Lviv Ukraine. And we're just here in a market in the center of town where the dollar goes very far. We've been sourcing local products here. Once we get requests from the refugees we had met with the director of the refugee humanitarian aid over the Lavi train station where over I mean, it was 110,000 people a day that had come through that train station. Now it's about 25 to 30,000 people that come to Lavi to head to points west. And so we met with those individuals there, we got a specific list and now we've been running around Lavi sourcing that list, making sure that those specific needs get met and trying to think of the things that other people are not thinking of. One of the projects that we're embarking on now is Easter's a very big holiday here in this country.

And it's a very big tradition that you would normally have with family. And so what we are doing is we're gonna be able to do some Easter baskets with some traditional Ukrainian food where these refugees up in the RNA will be able to just have that time together as a family as they're traveling to points west displaced during this war. So, you know, think of a motivational speaker and what I might be able to do over here, of course, building morale and keeping families you know, just in, in good spirits is something that we want to do.
